It is now clear that the implementation of IFRS was not just a technical revolution. It was a "once-in-a-generation" transformation of the business landscape – and on a global scale.

The IFRS 2007/8 Conference provides the opportunity for companies and their advisors to seize the competitive advantages made available by this transformation. Understanding the nuances, the detail and the strategies involved is key. The conference will open with a unique chance of a dialogue with the man who has masterminded the IFRS revolution, Sir David Tweedie, the Chairman of the International Accounting Standards Board. Cearns of Herbert Smith will provide advice on how to cope with the legal and tax issues.

Now that the dust has settled after the first year of IFRS implementation it has become clear that regulation, both global and national, has become a crucial future issue for companies and their advisors. Paul Boyle, Chief Executive of the Financial Reporting Council and a key player in the business of global regulation, will provide insight and information on potential areas of concern for companies. Bill Knight, Chairman of the Financial Reporting Review Panel will provide guidance on what the Panel will be looking out for across the next year of IFRS reporting and will provide insight on pitfalls and trends which the Panel has picked up in recent months.

No other conference this year will provide such a comprehensive package of insight, information and discussion of all the issues which affect the financial reporting community: the preparers of accounts and all who advise them.

SIR DAVID TWEEDIE is Chairman of the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) and is the architect of the new IFRS system. Previously, he chaired the UK's Accounting Standards Board for 10 years.

KENNETH LEE is Head of Accounting and Valuation Research for Europe with Citi Investment Research. He is the author of *Accounting for Investment Analysts: An International Perspective* and a co-author of *Company Valuation under IFRS*.

KEN LEVER has been the Finance Director of Tomkins plc since November 1999. Ken is a Chartered Accountant. He is the Chairman of the 100 Group Financial Reporting Committee.

KEN WILD is Deloitte's Global Leader, IFRS. He is also the National Director of Assurance and Advisory Services for the firm in the UK.

BILL HICKS is the Director of External Financial Reporting at AstraZeneca plc. He is responsible for the preparation of the company's Annual Report and 20-F and was heavily involved in the transition to IFRS.

RUSSELL PICOT is Group General Manager and Group Chief Accounting Officer HSBC Holdings plc. He is the HSBC Group's representative on the Financial Advisory Panel of the British Bankers' Association.

KATHRYN CEARNS is a consultant within the corporate division of Herbert Smith. She is also Chairman of the Technical Advisory Committee of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England & Wales.

PAUL BOYLE is the Chief Executive of the Financial Reporting Council, the independent regulator responsible for promoting confidence in corporate reporting and governance. He was previously the Chief Operating Officer of the Financial Services Authority.

BILL KNIGHT has chaired the Financial Reporting Review Panel since 2004. He is a former senior partner of Simmons & Simmons and was chairman of the Law Society's Company Law Committee.

MICHAEL IZZA became Chief Executive of the ICAEW in December 2006. He was previously Director of Finance and Operations and then Chief Operating Officer.
