Hans-Georg Bruns, IASB member, to retire

The International Accounting Standards Committee (IASC) Foundation announced today that Hans-Georg Bruns will be stepping down as a member of the International Accounting

Standards Board (IASB) with effect from 30 June 2007.

A founding member of the IASB, Dr Bruns has played an important role in shaping the

platform of the high quality International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) in use today

in nearly 100 countries. As the former chief accounting officer of Daimler Chrysler and a

professor of the University of Stuttgart, he has been instrumental in developing strong

relationships with both governments and stakeholders across the European Union.

Commenting on the retirement of Dr Bruns, Sir David Tweedie, Chairman of the IASB, said:

Hans has made a significant contribution during his six years at the IASB. I am

grateful for his support during this time, and I wish him an enjoyable and relaxing

retirement.

Philip Laskawy, Chairman of the Trustees of the IASC Foundation, said:

Hans has been a dedicated advocate of international accounting standards, key

contributor to the work of the IASB, and an important bridge to the corporate

community in Europe. We can well understand his desire to spend more time with his

family and appreciate his willingness to continue with us for the next critical months

in IASB decision-making. We wish him all the best.

The IASC Foundation will begin the process of seeking candidates to fill the vacancy left by

Dr Bruns's retirement, together with a part-time IASB position, in line with its normal

appointment procedures.
